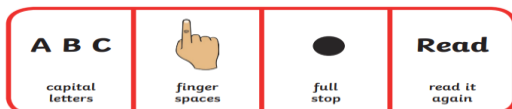
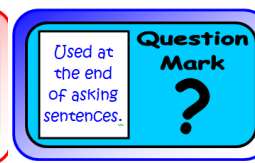
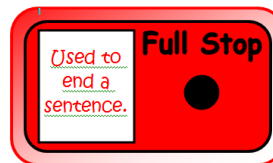


Key Vocabulary	
Noun	Nouns are sometimes called naming words because they name people, places and things
Adjective	Adjectives add more detail to a noun, e.g. <i>tall, small</i>
Verb	Verbs are sometimes called 'doing' words because many verbs name an action that someone does, e.g. <i>run/cook</i>
Adverb	Adverbs provide more detail to the verb, e.g. <i>quickly/slowly</i>
Clause	A clause is a group of words that contain a subject and a verb.
Conjunction	A conjunction is a word that links words or phrases.
Question	A question asks something and it must have a question mark at the end of the question.
Statement	A statement states a fact or something that has happened, e.g. <i>'You are my friend'</i>
Command	A command is something that the person is instructed to do, e.g. <i>'Pick up the pencil.'</i>
Exclamation	When something is given an emphasis, followed by an exclamation mark, e.g. <i>'You are my friend!'</i>
Noun phrase	A phrase where an adjective is used before a noun to describe it, e.g. <i>blue table/fierce fox</i>
Tense	This shows whether you are writing in the past, present or future.

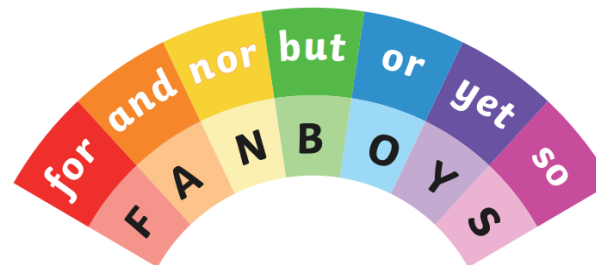


Conjunctions

Coordinating conjunctions link two main clauses; these clauses would make sense on their own without the conjunction.

Co-ordinating Conjunctions

There are seven co-ordinating conjunctions. They give equal importance to the words or sentences they connect.



Subordinating conjunctions introduce a subordinate clause, which is a clause that is dependent on a main clause.

Subordinating Conjunctions

Here are 10 of the most common subordinating conjunctions. They are used at the beginning of a subordinate clause which is a clause that doesn't make sense on its own.



How to help
